Carolwood Pacific Railroad In 1953, after an accident occurred in which a guest was injured, the CPRR was closed to the public. The backyard railroad attracted visitors to Disney's home; he invited them to ride and occasionally drive his miniature train. The railroad, which became operational in 1950, was 2,615 feet (797 m) long and encircled his house. applied to the miniature interior of the caboose, which included a calendar hung on the wall, a broom, and a working potbelly stove. It pulled a set of freight cars, as well as a caboose that was almost entirely built by Disney himself. Except for its frame and The Carolwood Pacific Railroad (CPRR) was a 7+1/4-inch (184 mm) gauge rideable miniature railroad run by Walt Disney in the backyard of his home in the Holmby Hills neighborhood of Los Angeles, California. It featured the Lilly Belle, a 1:8-scale live steam locomotive named after Disney's wife, Lillian Disney, and built by the Walt Disney Studios' machine shop. The locomotive made its first test run on December 24, 1949. It was Disney's lifelong fascination with trains, as well as his interest in miniature models, that led to the creation of the CPRR d94215114e

There are accounts, including by William Forbes Skene and Alexander Macbain, that state that William Mackintosh, 15th of Mackintosh had burned the Earl of Huntly's Auchindoun Castle which is why Huntly had him executed in 1550. According to other historians, the violence was triggered by the refusal of Zionist leaders to accept British offers of shared representation in Palestine, which was accepted by the Arab leadership. Scholars have also pointed to the transfer of land to the Jewish National Fund, which, along with rising concerns over land sales and immigration, contributed to socioeconomic anxieties that helped fuel the outbreak. d94215114e

Bolton Priory There is today a full liturgical calendar, together with the Bolton Priory Concert Series and the annual St Cuthbert Bolton Priory, whose full title is The Priory Church of St Mary and St Cuthbert, Bolton Abbey, is a Grade I listed parish church of the Church of England in the village of Bolton Abbey, within the Yorkshire Dales National Park in North Yorkshire, England. It was designed in part to remove all religious and royalist influences from the calendar, and it was part of a larger attempt at dechristianisation and decimalisation in France (which also included decimal time of day, decimalisation of currency, and metrication). The calendar consisted of twelve 30-day months, each divided into three 10-day cycles similar to weeks, plus five or six intercalary days at the end to fill out the balance of a solar year d94215114e

Corder was located in London, where he had married. He was returned to Suffolk and found guilty of murder in a well-publicised trial. In 1828, he was hanged at Bury St Edmunds in an execution witnessed by a huge crowd. The story provoked numerous newspaper articles, songs and plays. The village where the crime had taken place became a tourist attraction and the barn was stripped by souvenir hunters. The main tower of the Castle was the Danish Tower, and the building was in use by the Constable family until it was abandoned when Sir Robert Constable was executed on 6 July 1537, causing his family to forfeit Flamborough Castle among thirty-four other manors to the King.
