Sociology The term sociology was coined in the late 18th century to describe the scientific study of society. Ecosystem service Ecosystem services are grouped into four broad categories of services. Evaluations of ecosystem services may include assigning an economic value to them. Per the 2006 Millennium Ecosystem Ecosystem services are the various benefits that humans derive from ecosystems. The interconnected living and non-living components of the natural environment offer benefits such as pollination of crops, clean air and water, decomposition of wastes, and flood control. this concept. Ecosystem services or eco-services are defined as the goods and services provided by ecosystems to humans. There are provisioning services, such as the production of food and water; regulating services, such as the control of climate and disease; supporting services, such as nutrient cycles and oxygen production; and cultural services, such as recreation, tourism, and spiritual gratification f03dbca66c

It involves the effective functioning of social groups through interpersonal relationships, a shared sense of identity, a shared understanding, shared norms, shared values, trust, cooperation, and reciprocity. Social vulnerability Social vulnerability refers to the inability of people, organizations, and societies to withstand adverse impacts from multiple stressors to which they are exposed. This theory has been developed by social psychologists to study the support for human rights In its broadest sense, social vulnerability is one dimension of vulnerability to multiple stressors and shocks, including abuse, social exclusion and natural hazards. reestablish the lost norms and trigger forms of collective resilience.
