Communication accommodation theory Howard Giles' communication accommodation theory (CAT), "seeks to explain and predict when, how, and why individuals engage in interactional adjustments with others," such as a person changing their accent to match the individual they are speaking with. Additionally, CAT studies "recipients' inferences, attributions, and evaluations of, and responses to, them." This means when speakers change their communication style, listeners are interpreting such alterations. For example, when the speaker adjusts their accent to match the listener's, the recipient may interpret this positively, perceiving it as the speaker trying to fit in, or negatively—questioning whether they are mocking them

"Leadership" is a contested term. Specialist literature debates various viewpoints on the

concept, sometimes contrasting Eastern and Western approaches to leadership, and also (within the West) North American versus European approaches. A group does not necessarily constitute a team. Teams normally have members with complementary skills. Systems theory has been formalized since the 1950s, and a long set of specialized systems theories and cybernetics exist. In the beginnings, general systems theory was developed by Ludwig von Bertalanffy to overcome the over-specialisation of the modern times and as a worldview using holism. The systems theories nowadays are closer to the traditional specialisation than to holism, by interdependencies and mutual division by mutually-different specialists. through a coordinated effort which allows each member to maximize their strengths and minimize their weaknesses.
