Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability The Turing test, originally called the imitation game by Alan Turing in 1949, is a test of a machine's ability to exhibit intelligent behaviour equivalent to that of a human. Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability in performance capacity, the verbal version generalizes naturally to all of human performance capacity, verbal as well as nonverbal (robotic). In the test, a human evaluator judges a text transcript of a natural-language conversation between a human and a machine. machine's ability to answer questions correctly, only on how closely its answers resembled those of a human. The evaluator tries to identify the machine, and the machine passes if the evaluator cannot reliably tell them apart 028d038333
