Thought In a broader sense, any mental event—including perception and unconscious processes—may be described as a form of thought. Core forms include judging, reasoning, concept formation, problem solving, and deliberation. the solution is presented to the thinker in a sudden flash of insight and accepted straight away. Unlike perception, these activities can occur without immediate input from the sensory organs. Other processes, such as entertaining an idea, memory, or imagination, are also

frequently considered types of thought. The term can also denote not the process itself, but the resulting mental states or systems of ideas. Critical thinking plays an important role in education: In their most common sense, thought and thinking refer to cognitive processes that occur independently of direct sensory stimulation 1c2ce22869

Critical thinking The goal of critical thinking is to form a judgment through the application of rational, skeptical, and unbiased analyses and evaluation. In an early dialogue by Plato,[citation Critical thinking is the process of analyzing available facts, evidence, observations, and arguments to make sound conclusions or informed choices. It involves recognizing underlying assumptions, providing justifications for ideas and actions, evaluating these justifications through comparisons with varying perspectives, and assessing their rationality and potential consequences. In modern times, the use of the phrase critical thinking can be traced to John Dewey, who used the phrase reflective thinking, which depends on the knowledge base of an individual; the excellence of critical thinking in which an individual can engage varies according to it.
