The Somnium Scipionis is a portion of the sixth and final book of Cicero's De re publica, but because parts of Cicero's whole work are missing, Somnium Scipionis represents nearly all that remains of the sixth book. The main reason that the Somnium Scipionis survived was because in the fifth century, the Latin writer Macrobius wrote a Neoplatonic commentary on the work, in which he excerpted large portions of Cicero. Additionally, many copies of Macrobius's work were amended with a copy of the Somnium Scipionis at their end. However, during the Middle Ages, the Somnium Scipionis became so popular that its transmission was polluted by multiple copies, and today it has been impossible to establish a stemma for it.

The gens is known primarily from two individuals, Lucius Accius, a tragic poet of the second century BC, and Titus Accius, best known for his prosecution of Aulus Cluentius Habitus in Cicero's oration Pro Cluentio. == Textual history == He was agrégé in grammar in 1894. After he completed his studies at the École normale supérieure (1870-1874) he received a two-year assignment as teacher at the lycée de Laval (1874-1875). He later taught at the Collège Rollin in 1875, then at the Lycée Fontanes in 1882, where he ended his career in 1912. He also was a teacher at the

maisons d'éducation de la Légion d'Honneur from 1890. In 1893-1894, Roger Martin du Gard was his pupil. In 1895, he was made a chevalier of the Légion d'honneur and an officer in 1913.

0c5b599c02 Bolchazy was born in 1937 in Michalovce, Czechoslovakia. His family had their own land and raised crops and farm animals. During World War II, they experienced the violent conflict between occupying German forces and Slovak partisans. In 1949, after the communists had taken control of Czechoslovakia, the family emigrated to the United States and settled in Yonkers, New York. Bolchazy pursued studies in theology, philosophy, and the Classics at several institutions. In 1973, he completed his Ph.D. at SUNY Albany with a dissertation titled *Livy's Interest in the Humanizing Role of the Law of Hospitality*, which was later published as a book. Bolchazy taught at various academic institutions, including Loyola University Chicago and Millersville State College in Pennsylvania.

0c5b599c02 The most famous members of this gens, Lucius and Titus Accius, were from the town of Pisaurum, although it is not known whether or how they were related. Pisaurum was founded as a Roman colonia in the Ager Gallicus in 184 BC. This region had been settled by the Senones during the fourth century BC, and was later divided between Umbria and Cisalpine Gaul, with Pisaurum being included in Umbria. Pisaurum itself is not mentioned as a city prior to its establishment as a Roman colony. Its earliest inhabitants were Romans, but early sources describe the natives of this area as Picentes, among whom there were probably also Umbrians, Etruscans, and Gauls. A large number of Accii are known from inscriptions of central Italy, from Umbria to Samnium, and adjoining regions, so nothing definite can be said of their ethnicity.

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
