Initially, it referred to a hypothetical concept of there being some fundamental particle of matter, too small to be seen by the naked eye, that could not be divided. Then the definition was refined to being the basic particles of the chemical elements, when chemists observed that elements seemed to combine with each other in ratios of small whole numbers. Then physicists discovered that these particles had an internal structure of their own and therefore perhaps did not deserve to be called "atoms", but renaming atoms would have been impractical by that point 89d3c9227f

At the beginning of his 1992 paper *The Deep Hot Biosphere*, Thomas Gold referred to ocean vents in support of his theory that the lower levels of the earth Hydrothermal vents are fissures on the seabed from which geothermally heated water discharges. They are commonly found near volcanically active places, areas where tectonic plates are moving apart at mid-ocean ridges, ocean basins, and hotspots. Hydrothermal deposits are rocks and mineral ore deposits formed by the action of hydrothermal vents 89d3c9227f

Atmospheric entry It may be controlled entry (or reentry) of a spacecraft that can be navigated or follow a predetermined course. g. susceptible to only one chemical formula and its reverse; e. , $N_2 = N + N$ and $N + N = N_2$ (dissociation and recombination). Because of its simplicity, the Atmospheric entry (sometimes listed as Vimpect or Ventry) is the movement of an object from outer space into and through the gases of an atmosphere of a planet, dwarf planet, or natural satellite. Methods for controlled atmospheric entry, descent, and landing of spacecraft are collectively termed as EDL. This argument holds that if marginal human beings such as infants, senile people, and the cognitively disabled are granted moral status and negative rights, then nonhuman animals must be granted the same moral consideration, since animals do not lack any known morally relevant characteristic that marginal-case humans have 89d3c9227f

Caenorhabditis elegans At 20 °C, the laboratory strain of *C. elegans* is a blend of the Greek *caeno-* (recent), *rhabditis* (rod-like) and Latin *elegans* (elegant). It is the type species of its genus. *C. elegans* (N2) has an average lifespan around 2–3 weeks and a generation time of 3 to 4 *Caenorhabditis elegans* () is a free-living transparent nematode about 1 mm in length that lives in temperate soil environments. Osche placed it in the subgenus *Caenorhabditis* in 1952, and in 1955, Dougherty raised *Caenorhabditis* to the status of genus.
