Dissociative identity disorder Delusions or auditory Dissociative identity disorder (DID), previously known as multiple personality disorder (MPD), is characterized by the presence of at least two personality states or "alters". Critics of the trauma model support the sociogenic (fantasy) model of DID as a societal construct and learned

behavior used to express underlying distress, developed through iatrogenesis in therapy, cultural beliefs about the disorder, and exposure to the concept in media or online forums.
