Polio Years after recovery, post-polio syndrome may occur, with a slow development of muscle weakness similar to what the person had during the initial infection. A less common symptom is permanent paralysis, and possible death in extreme cases. and leads to the development of minor influenza-like symptoms. Approximately 75% of cases are asymptomatic; mild symptoms which can occur include sore throat and fever; in a proportion of cases more severe symptoms develop such as headache, neck stiffness, and paresthesia. Rarely, this may progress and the virus may invade the central nervous system, provoking Poliomyelitis (POH-lee-oh-MY-ə-LY-tiss), commonly shortened to polio, is an infectious disease caused by the poliovirus.
