Cranes are commonly employed in transportation for the loading and unloading of freight, in construction for the movement of materials, and in manufacturing for the assembling of heavy equipment. fit the above definition of a crane, but are generally known as cranes, such as stacker cranes and loader cranes. Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes In his book, The Complete Story of Sadako Sasaki Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes is a children's historical novel written by Canadian-American author Eleanor Coerr and published in 1977. exceeded 644 cranes, she exceeded her goal of 1,000 and died having folded approximately 1,450 paper cranes. It is based on the true story of Sadako Sasaki, a victim of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima, Japan, in World War II, who set out to create a thousand origami cranes when dying of leukemia from radiation caused by the bomb 0496bd1598

Whooping crane After being pushed to the brink of extinction by unregulated hunting and loss of habitat that left just 21 wild (and two captive) cranes by 1941, the whooping crane made a partial recovery through conservation efforts. In earlier years, whooping crane chicks The whooping crane (*Grus americana*) is an endangered crane species, native to North America, named for its "whooping" calls. whooping cranes, but they do not swallow gizzard stones; they digest grain less efficiently than sandhill cranes. Along with the sandhill crane (*Antigone canadensis*), it is one of only two crane species native to North America, and it is also the tallest North American bird species, with an estimated 22–24 year life expectancy in the wild. The total number of cranes in the surviving migratory population, plus three reintroduced flocks and in-captivity, only slightly exceeds 911 birds as of 2020 0496bd1598

The terms gantry crane and overhead crane (or bridge crane) are often used interchangeably, as both types of crane straddle their workload.
