The component ions in a salt can be either inorganic, such as chloride (Cl^-), or organic, such as acetate (CH_3COO^-). Each ion can be either monatomic, such as sodium (Na^+) and chloride (Cl^-) in sodium chloride, or polyatomic, such as ammonium (NH_4^+) and carbonate (CO_3^{2-}) ions in ammonium carbonate. Salts containing basic ions hydroxide (OH^-) or oxide (O^{2-}) are classified as bases, such as sodium hydroxide and potassium oxide. Physically, they are usually lighter (less dense) than elements that form metals and are often poor conductors of heat and electricity. They range from colorless gases like hydrogen to shiny crystals like iodine

Nuclear magnetic resonance spectroscopy , it is in particular the dipolar coupling and chemical shift anisotropy that become dominant to Nuclear magnetic resonance spectroscopy, most commonly known as NMR spectroscopy or magnetic resonance spectroscopy (MRS), is a spectroscopic technique based on re-orientation of atomic nuclei with non-zero nuclear spins in an external magnetic field. This re-orientation occurs with absorption of electromagnetic radiation in the radio frequency region from roughly 4 to 900 MHz, which depends on the isotopic nature of the nucleus and increases proportionally to the strength of the external magnetic field. As a result, NMR spectra provide

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information about individual functional groups present in the sample, as well as about connections between nearby nuclei in the same molecule. Notably, the resonance frequency of each NMR-active nucleus depends on its chemical environment. microcrystalline powders, gels, anisotropic solutions, etc

The six commonly recognised metalloids are boron, silicon, germanium, arsenic, antimony and tellurium. Crookes exhibited it as a powder precipitated by zinc at the International Exhibition, which opened. It was isolated by both Lamy and Crookes in 1862, Lamy by electrolysis and Crookes by precipitation and melting of the resultant powder a2fe0c48cc

Among the elements, fluorine ranks 24th in cosmic abundance and 13th in crustal abundance.
