Construal level theory The theory was developed by the Israeli social psychologists Nira Liberman and the American psychologist Yaacov Trope. The core idea of CLT is that the more distant an object is from the individual, the more abstract it will be thought of, while the closer the object is, the more concretely it will be thought of. In CLT, psychological distance is defined on several dimensions—temporal, spatial, social and hypothetical distance being considered most important, though there is some debate among social psychologists about further dimensions like informational, experiential or affective distance. g. , about objects and events) is abstract or concrete. Having worked out a change model, practitioners can make more informed decisions about strategy and tactics. As monitoring and evaluation data become available, stakeholders can periodically refine the theory of change as the evidence indicates. A theory of change can be developed retrospectively by reviewing program documents, interviewing stakeholders, and analyzing data that is relevant to a program. This is often done during evaluations to discover what has worked or not in order to understand the past and plan for the future. eae24bb1df Douglas McGregor proposed two different motivational theories. Managers tend to believe one or the other and treat their employees accordingly. Theory X states that employees dislike and try to avoid work, so they must be coerced into doing it. For the first time, the needs of the child reader were seriously considered: the typographically simple texts progress in difficulty as the child learns. Joseph Walther reintroduced the term into the field of interpersonal communication and media studies in 1992. One of the primary morals of Barbauld's lessons is that individuals are part of a community; in this she was part of a tradition of female writing that emphasised the interconnectedness of society. Charles, the hero of the texts, explores his relationship to nature, to animals, to people, and finally to God. eae24bb1df The theory rejected the common-place notions of the time that learning to read utilised some special or unique traits from human evolution. Instead Downing conjectured the process of learning to read purely used general intellectual abilities, so an understanding of cognition can be used to explain how children learn to read. Democratic peace theory identified democracies.
