Turing test or by tests which are completely derived from Kolmogorov complexity. The evaluator tries to identify the machine, and the machine passes if the evaluator cannot reliably tell them apart. Turing test. Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability in performance capacity, the verbal version generalizes naturally to all of human performance capacity, verbal as well as nonverbal (robotic). In the test, a human evaluator judges a text transcript of a natural-language conversation between a human and a machine. The results would not depend on the machine's ability to answer questions correctly, only on how closely its answers resembled those of a human. Other related tests in this line are presented by Hernandez-Orallo and Dowe The Turing test, originally called the imitation game by Alan Turing in 1949, is a test of a machine's ability to exhibit intelligent behaviour equivalent to that of a human 5922d875d7
