A Tale of a Tub A satire on the Roman Catholic and Anglican churches and English Dissenters, it was famously attacked for its profanity and irreligion, starting with William Wotton, who wrote that it made a game of "God and Religion, Truth and Moral Honesty, Learning and Industry" to show "at the bottom [the author's] contemptible Opinion of every Thing which is called Christianity. The work is a prose parody divided into sections of "digression" and a "tale" of three brothers, each representing one of the main branches of western Christianity from the 17th-century English perspective. ". both in "The Apology for the &c. &c." and in a reference in Book I of Gulliver's Travels, to have written the Tale to defend the crown from the troubles of A Tale of a Tub was the first major work written by Jonathan Swift, composed between 1694 and 1697 and published in London in 1704

Of the surviving twelve sermons, four have received serious consideration: "Doing Good", "False Witness", "Mutual Subjection" and "Testimony of Conscience". These sermons deal with political matters and are used to give insight to Swift's political writing; the sermon "Doing Good...

John Arbuthnot membership in the Scriblerus Club (where he inspired Jonathan Swift's Gulliver's Travels book III and Alexander Pope's Peri Bathous, Or the Art of Sinking John Arbuthnot FRS (baptised 29 April 1667 – 27 February 1735), often known simply as Dr Arbuthnot, was a Scottish physician, satirist and polymath in London. He is best remembered for his contributions to mathematics, his membership in the Scriblerus Club (where he inspired Jonathan Swift's Gulliver's Travels book III and Alexander Pope's Peri Bathous, Or the Art of Sinking in Poetry, Memoirs of Martin Scriblerus, and possibly The Dunciad), and for inventing the figure of John Bull

Literary criticism Although the two activities are closely related, literary critics are not always, and have not always been, theorists. Jonathan Swift, for instance, were criticized including his book Gulliver's Travels, which one critic described as "the detestable story of the Yahoos"; A genre of arts criticism, literary criticism or literary studies is the study, evaluation, and

Several scholars have used "On Fairy-Stories" as a route to understanding Tolkien's own fantasy, *The Lord of the Rings*, complete with its sub-created world of Middle-earth. Fantasy cartography Stefan Ekman says, "a [regular] map re-presents what is already there; a fictional map is often primary - to create the map means, largely, to create the world of the map. ". map-accompanied fictional texts from the time are Jonathan Swift's *Gulliver's Travels* (1726) and Robert Louis Stevenson's *Treasure Island* (1883). Fantasy cartography usually manifests from worldbuilding and often corresponds to narratives within the fantasy and science fiction genres. John Bunyan's Fantasy cartography, fictional map-making, or geofiction is a type of map design that visually presents an imaginary world or concept, or represents a real-world geography in a fantastic style c17f50ee6f

The essay is significant because it contains Tolkien's explanation of his philosophy on fantasy, and his thoughts on mythopoeia and sub-creation or worldbuilding. Alongside his 1936 essay "*Beowulf: The Monsters and the Critics*", it is his most influential scholarly work. c17f50ee6f

Sermons of Jonathan Swift Although Swift is better known today for his secular writings such as *Gulliver's Travels*, *A Tale of a*

Tub or the Drapier's Letters, Swift was known in Dublin Jonathan Swift, as Dean of St. In his sermons Swift attempted to impart traditional Church of Ireland values to his listeners in a plain manner. Patrick's Cathedral in Dublin, produced many sermons during his tenure from 1713 to 1745. Although Swift is better known today for his secular writings such as Gulliver's Travels, A Tale of a Tub or the Drapier's Letters, Swift was known in Dublin for his sermons that were delivered every fifth Sunday. Of these sermons, Swift wrote down 35, of which 12 have been preserved

Morlock Wells for his 1895 novel The Time Machine (the other being the Eloi). Since their creation by Wells, Morlock characters have appeared in many other works, including sequels, films, television shows, as well as in works by other authors (many of which deviate from the original description). place The Time Machine more in the genre than do the Lilliputians in Gulliver's Travels. He reasoned that the Lilliputians are merely diminutive humans, whereas Morlocks are one of the two fictional species of post-humans created by H. G. The origin of the names is not established (with regard to Wells' inspiration or inspirations). In the Wells' story, the Morlocks are the novel's main antagonists
