Acadian (automobile) As with the concurrent Chevy II, Acadians were offered with four-cylinder, six-cylinder, and V8 engines. The brand was also offered in Chile, with models built in Arica. The Acadian was introduced so Canadian Pontiac-Buick dealers would have a compact model to sell, since the Pontiac Tempest was unavailable in Canada. No Mark IV (big block) Acadians were ever produced. Acadian is a make of automobile produced by General Motors of Canada from 1962 to 1971. Plans originally called for the Acadian to be based on the Chevrolet Corvair, which was produced at GM's Oshawa plant; however, the concept was moved to the Chevy II platform to be introduced for 1962.

Chevrolet had introduced its popular small-block V8 in 1955, but needed something larger to power its medium duty trucks and the heavier cars that were on the drawing board. The big-block, which debuted in 1958 at 348 cu in (5.7 L), was built in standard displacements up to 496 cu in (8.1 L), with aftermarket crate engines sold by Chevrolet exceeding...

Chevrolet Delray Even the fuel injected version was available to 210 buyers. The Chevrolet Delray, named after the Delray neighborhood of Detroit, Michigan, debuted in 1954 as an optional trim level on two-door models of Chevrolet's mid-range 210 series of cars. quad-barrel carburetors rated at 225 hp (168 kW). New for 1957 was the 283 in³ small-block V8. In 1958, it became a distinct series of its own at the bottom of Chevrolet's lineup (replacing the discontinued 150), and added a four-door sedan, and sedan delivery, but it only remained in production for that model year.

Beaumont (automobile) the small block 283 V8, and to a lesser extent, the 327 V8 with the Powerglide transmission, allowing for fuel economy and reasonable performance at higher speeds. Beaumont was a make of mid-sized automobiles produced by General Motors of Canada from 1964 to 1969. Its logo consisted of an arrow, similar to that of Pontiac, but with a maple leaf to signify its dual heritage from both sides of Lake Ontario. These cars were based on the Chevrolet Chevelle, but the line had its own logo and nameplate, and was neither marketed nor actively sold in the United States.

Chevrolet Chevy II / Nova The Nova nameplate returned in 1985, produced through 1988 as a S-car based, NUMMI manufactured, subcompact based on the front wheel drive, Japan home-based Toyota Sprinter. Built on the X-body platform, the Nova was the top selling model in the Chevy II lineup through 1968. It was replaced by the 1980 Chevrolet Citation introduced in the spring of 1979. The Chevy II nameplate was dropped after 1968, with Nova becoming the nameplate for all of the 1969 through 1979 models. The Chevrolet
