Botany A botanist or plant scientist is a scientist who specialises in this field. Phytologists or botanists (in the strict sense) study approximately 410,000 species of land plants, including some 391,000 species of vascular plants (of which approximately 369,000 are flowering plants) and approximately 20,000 bryophytes. "Plant" and "botany" may be defined more narrowly to include only land plants and their study, which is also known as phytology. vegetation that an environment can support and Tansley introduced the concept of ecosystems to biology. Central America is usually defined as consisting of seven countries: Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Panama. Barrier Reef is home to a large diversity of plants and animals, and is one of the most diverse ecosystems of the world. Due to the presence of several active geologic faults and the Central America Volcanic Arc, there is a high amount of seismic activity in the region, such as volcanic eruptions and earthquakes, which has resulted in death, injury, and property damage. Its political boundaries are defined as bordering Mexico to the north, Colombia to the southeast, the Caribbean to the east, and the Pacific Ocean to the southwest 1ff3ee35e0

Forest management The two concepts, sustainable forest management and the ecosystem approach, aim at promoting Forest management is a branch of forestry concerned with overall administrative, legal, economic, and social aspects, as well as scientific and technical aspects, such as silviculture, forest protection, and forest regulation. Techniques

include timber extraction, planting and replanting of different species, building and maintenance of roads and pathways through forests, and preventing fire. Management objectives can be for conservation, utilisation, or a mixture of the two. means of applying the Ecosystem Approach to forest ecosystems. This includes management for timber, aesthetics, recreation, urban values, water, wildlife, inland and nearshore fisheries, wood products, plant genetic resources, and other forest resource values

Plant Earth's biomes are named for the type of vegetation because plants are the dominant organisms in those biomes, such as grassland, savanna, and tropical. Plants are the eukaryotes that comprise the kingdom Plantae; they are predominantly photosynthetic. This means that they obtain their energy from sunlight, using chloroplasts derived from endosymbiosis with cyanobacteria to produce sugars from carbon dioxide and water, using the green pigment chlorophyll. Most plants are multicellular, except for some green algae. Exceptions are parasitic plants that have lost the genes for chlorophyll and photosynthesis, and obtain their energy from other plants or fungi

Landscape-scale conservation Landscape-scale conservation may sometimes be attempted because of climate change. impacts on terrestrial ecosystems or sustainable water management. Climate In a broader sense, climate is the state of the components of the climate system, including the atmosphere, hydrosphere, cryosphere, lithosphere and biosphere and the interactions between them. Some of the meteorological variables that are commonly measured are temperature, humidity, atmospheric pressure, wind, and precipitation. The climate of a location is affected by its latitude, longitude, terrain, altitude, land use and nearby water bodies and their currents. A common shortcoming of these classification schemes is that they produce Climate is the long-term weather pattern in a region, typically averaged over 30 years. was originally designed to identify the climates associated with certain biomes. More rigorously, it is the mean and variability of meteorological variables over a time spanning from months to millions of years

In 2017, Locke was appointed chair of the IUCN World Commission on Protected Areas Beyond the Aichi Targets Task Force, with the goal of ensuring the new global conservation targets set at the next Conference of the Parties of the Convention on Biological Diversity in 2020 are meaningful for achieving the conservation of nature and halting of biodiversity loss. He is a founder of the Yellowstone to Yukon Conservation Initiative, with the goal to create a continuous corridor for wildlife from Yellowstone National Park in the United States to the Yukon in Northern Canada. He is a recognized global leader in the field of parks, wilderness, wildlife and large landscape conservation

Woody plant encroachment Woody encroachment is observed across different ecosystems and with different characteristics and intensities globally. It refers to the expansion of native plants and not the spread of alien invasive species. Environmental conditions: Arid ecosystems show more negative responses to woody encroachment than non-arid ecosystems. In arid ecosystems woody encroachment is Woody plant encroachment (also called woody encroachment, bush encroachment, shrub encroachment, shrubification, woody plant proliferation, or bush thickening) is a natural phenomenon characterised by the area expansion and density increase of woody plants, bushes and shrubs, at the expense of the herbaceous layer, grasses and forbs. It predominantly occurs in grasslands, savannas and woodlands and can cause regime shifts from open grasslands and savannas to closed woodlands 1ff3ee35e0

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
