It was published in Chicago by the general executive board of the IWW, under various editors. Debs, Bartolomeo Vanzetti, Ricardo Flores Magon, and Upton Sinclair

1934 California gubernatorial election Merriam, who had recently assumed the governorship following the death of James Rolph, characterized Sinclair's proposal as a step towards communism. Held in the midst of the Great Depression, the 1934 election was amongst the most controversial in the state's political history. Haight. The new editor was a Communist, however, and this alienated the non-Communist majority of IWW members. He was removed as editor in 1922. bd922ae0fc

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
