Tryptophan Institute of Medicine Tryptophan (symbol Trp or W) is an α -amino acid that is used in the biosynthesis of proteins. In contrast with other antioxidants, IPA was not converted to reactive intermediates with pro-oxidant activity. It is encoded by the codon UGG. Tryptophan contains an α -amino group, an α -carboxylic acid group, and a side chain indole, making it a polar molecule with a non-polar aromatic beta carbon substituent.

" is interpreted as a yes-or-no question when it is uttered with a single rising intonation contour, but is interpreted as an alternative question when uttered with a rising contour on "Spanish" and a falling contour on "French".
