Social information processing (theory) [clarification Social information processing theory, also known as SIP, is a psychological and sociological theory originally developed by Salancik and Pfeffer in 1978. This theory explores how individuals make decisions and form attitudes in a social context, often focusing on the workplace. develop a reputable and healthy relationship with the public in addition to the opinions and structure that they present in a non computer setting. It suggests that people rely heavily on the social information available to them in their environments, including input from colleagues and peers, to shape their attitudes, behaviors, and perceptions 99f8de41d8

The origins of the diffusion of innovations theory are varied and span multiple disciplines.
