Flap (aeronautics) Flaps are used to reduce the take-off distance and the landing distance. the lift, and the outboard half to supply a reduced proportion of the lift. The flaps installed on most aircraft are partial-span flaps; spanwise from near the wing root to the inboard end of the ailerons. When partial-span flaps are extended they alter the spanwise lift distribution on the wing by causing the inboard half of the wing to supply an increased proportion of the lift, and the outboard half to supply a reduced proportion of the lift.
