The first extant sources discussing such theories are found in ancient Greek philosophy. medieval Europe. This work was furthered through the Middle Ages by Indian, Islamic, and European scientists, before gaining great strides during the Renaissance and Scientific Revolution—culminating in the formulation of Newton's law of gravity.
