A heavy, silvery d-block element, mercury is the only metallic element that is known to be liquid at standard temperature and pressure; the only other element that is liquid under these conditions is the halogen bromine, though metals such as caesium, gallium, and rubidium melt just above room temperature

The VRLA battery uses An electric battery is a source of electric power consisting of one or more electrochemical cells with external connections for powering electrical devices. When a battery is connected to an external electric load, those negatively charged electrons flow through the circuit and reach the positive terminal, thus causing a redox reaction by attracting positively charged ions, or cations. When a battery is supplying power, its positive terminal is the cathode and its negative terminal is the anode. Historically the term "battery" specifically referred to a device composed of multiple. The terminal marked negative is the source of electrons. valve regulated lead-acid battery (VRLA battery) is popular in the automotive industry as a replacement for the lead-acid wet cell

DSV-5 Nemo NEMO is considered part of the Alvin class of Deep Submergence Vehicles despite bearing little resemblance to the other subs of the class. NEMO was found to be an effective observation platform, despite not being able to hover in place, and acrylic-hulled submersibles have continued to be built and operated in the United States.
