By the early 1980s several groups were already at work on diverse successors to MacLisp: Lisp Machine Lisp (aka ZetaLisp), Spice Lisp, NIL and S-1 Lisp. Common Lisp sought to unify, standardise, and extend the features of these MacLisp dialects. Common Lisp is not an implementation, but rather a language specification. In many states, practicing behavior analysts hold a license, certificate, or registration. principles of overlearning to help acquire mastery and fluency of skills. Professional practice seeks to change specific behavior through the implementation of these principles. The practice of behavior analysis is the delivery of interventions to consumers that are guided by the principles of radical behaviorism and the research of both experimental and applied behavior analysis. Attribute hierarchy method The results of a CDA yield a profile of scores with detailed information about a student's cognitive strengths and weaknesses. The AHM is one form of cognitive diagnostic assessment that aims to integrate cognitive psychology with educational measurement for the purposes of enhancing instruction and student learning. This cognitive diagnostic feedback has the potential to guide instructors, parents and students. A cognitive diagnostic assessment (CDA), is designed to measure specific knowledge states and cognitive processing skills in a given domain. Some U.S. academic environments define leadership as "a process of social influence in which a person can enlist the aid and support of others in the accomplishment of a common and ethical task". Picture Exchange Communication System The training protocol is based on the principles of applied behavior analysis. PECS was developed in 1985 at the Delaware Autism Program by Andy Bondy, PhD, and Lori Frost, MS, CCC-SLP. The goal of PECS is spontaneous and functional communication The Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS) is an augmentative and alternative communication system developed and produced by Pyramid Educational Consultants, Inc. Based on these observations, Bondy and Frost created a functional means of communication for individuals with a variety of communication challenges. communication skills. The developers of PECS noticed that traditional communication techniques, including speech imitation, sign language, and picture point systems, relied on the teacher to initiate social interactions and none focused on teaching students to initiate interactions. Although PECS was originally developed for young children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), its use has become 8ad03dfb31

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
