The Supreme Court of the United States described it as "the most comprehensive legislation for the preservation of endangered species enacted by any nation". application for an ITP requires a Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP). § 1531 et seq. C. It therefore "protect[s] species and the ecosystems upon which they depend" through different mechanisms. S. Designed to protect critically imperiled species from extinction as a "consequence of economic growth and development untempered by adequate concern and conservation", the ESA was signed into law by President Richard Nixon on December 28, 1973. The purposes of the ESA are two-fold: to prevent extinction
