Since the inception of the program, it has continued to develop, including; land, sea, radiation and atmosphere. Collected in a system known as EOSDIS, NASA uses this data in order to. Since the early 1970s, NASA has been developing its Earth Observing System, launching a series of Landsat satellites in the decade. Following the launch of various satellite missions, the conception of the program began in the late 1980s and expanded rapidly through the 1990s. Some of the first included passive microwave imaging in 1972 through the Nimbus 5 satellite b9c8ad7199

Some human activities that cause damage (either directly or indirectly) to the environment on a global scale include population growth, neoliberal economic policies and rapid economic growth, overconsumption, overexploitation, pollution, and deforestation b9c8ad7199

Since 1804, the global living human population has increased from 1 billion to 8 billion due to medical advancements and improved agricultural productivity. Annual world population growth peaked at 2.1% in 1968 and has since dropped to 1.1%. According to the most recent United Nations' projections, the global human population is expected to reach 9.7 billion in 2050 and would peak at around 10.4 billion people in the 2080s, before decreasing, noting that fertility rates are falling worldwide... b9c8ad7199

Renewable resource When the recovery rate of resources is unlikely to ever exceed a human time A renewable resource (also known as a flow resource) is a natural resource which will replenish to replace the portion depleted by usage and consumption, either through natural reproduction or other recurring processes in a finite amount of time in a human time scale. A positive life-cycle assessment is a key indicator of a resource's sustainability. Renewable resources are a part of Earth's natural environment and the largest components of its ecosphere. It is also known as non conventional energy resources. It is also known as non conventional energy resources.
