Futurism It emphasized dynamism, speed, technology, youth,
violence, and objects such as the car, the airplane, and the industrial
city. Italian Futurism glorified modernity and, according to its
doctrine, "aimed to liberate Italy from the weight of its past. Its key
figures included Italian artists Filippo Tommaso Marinetti, Umberto
Boccioni, Carlo Carrà, Fortunato Depero, Gino Severini, Giacomo
Balla, and Luigi Russolo. " Important Futurist works included
Marinetti's 1909 Manifesto of Futurism, Boccioni's 1913 sculpture
Unique Forms of Continuity in Space, Balla's 1913–1914 painting
Abstract Speed + Sound, and Russolo's The Art. After the war,
Marinetti revived the movement. This revival was called il secondo
Futurismo (Second Futurism) by writers in the 1960s. The art

movements worldwide. As of 2018, Italian films have won 14
Academy Awards for Best Foreign Language Film (the most of any
country) as well as 12 Palmes d'Or (the second-most of any country),
one Academy Award for Best Picture and many Golden Lions and
Golden Bears. Italy is one of the birthplaces of art cinema and the
stylistic aspect of film has been one of the most important factors in
