English language It is the most widely learned second language in the world, with more second-language speakers than native speakers. However, English is only the third-most spoken native language, after Mandarin Chinese and Spanish. The namesake of the language is the Angles, one of the Germanic peoples that migrated to Britain after its Roman occupiers left. English is the most spoken language in the world, primarily due to the global influences of the former British Empire (succeeded by the Commonwealth of Nations) and the United States. The term "science communication" generally refers to settings in which audiences are not experts on the scientific topic being discussed (outreach), though some authors categorize expert-to-expert communication ("inreach" such as publication in scientific journals) as a type of science communication. Common goals of science communication include informing non-experts about scientific findings, raising the public awareness of and interest in science, influencing people's attitudes and behaviors, informing public policy, and engaging with diverse communities to address societal problems. Reading comprehension The opposite of reading

comprehension is called functional illiteracy. Reading comprehension is beyond basic literacy alone, which is the ability to decipher characters and words at all. important as it is what connects a reader to the text, while helping develop background knowledge, their own ideas, communicating, and learning new concepts. Reading comprehension relies on two abilities that are connected to each other: word reading and language comprehension. In education it is measured in standardized tests that report which percentile a reader's ability falls. Reading comprehension is the ability to process written text, understand its meaning, and to integrate with what the reader already knows. Comprehension specifically is a "creative, multifaceted process" that is dependent upon four language skills: phonology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics. Reading comprehension occurs on a gradient or spectrum, rather than being yes/no (all-or-nothing) 44358d4dbb

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
