Japan Coast Guard The Japan Coast Guard was founded in 1948 as the Maritime Safety Agency and received its current English name in 2000. Coast guard operations were performed by the Imperial Japanese Navy during the Empire of Japan, but the ability of maintaining maritime security declined The Japan Coast Guard (Japanese: 海上保安庁, Hepburn: Kaijō Hoan-chō) is the coast guard responsible for the protection of the coastline of Japan under the oversight of the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism. Port Security Unit PSUs usually operate under the direction of the Coast Guard's Pacific Area command but are unique in that they are the only Coast Guard units that can be quickly requested by the Department of Defense. PSUs are expeditionary units that conduct OCONUS (Outside of Continental United States) missions in support of a requesting regional combatant commander. They perform anti-terrorism force protection missions, which include harbor and port security, expeditionary security, protection of High Value Assets (HVAs) and Sea Lines of Communications, and coastal surveillance. Port security Physical port security also falls under Port security is part of a broader definition concerning maritime security. involves adequate security systems within the port, such as security guards, video surveillance and alarm systems. Security risks related to ports often focus on either the physical security of the port, or security risks within the maritime supply chain. It includes the protection of the seaports themselves and the protection and inspection of the cargo moving through the ports.
