Corn smut One of several cereal crop pathogens called smut, the fungus forms galls on all above-ground parts of corn species such as maize and teosinte. The infected corn is edible; in Mexico, it is considered a delicacy, called huitlacoche, often eaten as a filling in quesadillas and other tortilla-based dishes, as well as in soups. Mary Elizabeth Banning She Mary Elizabeth Banning (6 April 1822 - 28 February 1903) was an American mycologist (fungi biologist) and botanical illustrator from Maryland. She formally described 23 previously unknown species of fungi, publishing their type descriptions in the Botanical Gazette and Charles Peck's "Annual Report of the New York State Botanist". She was the first woman outside of Europe to name a fungal taxon. With her own money, she bought a microscope and started to amass a scientific library and private herbarium. finally gravitating to the study of fungi f24144e6b5

He described the genera *Spinalia* and *Zygorhynchus*. The mushroom genus *Vuilleminia* (Maire) is named after him. In 1901 he transferred the yeast-like fungus that was named *Saccharomyces hominis* by Otto Busse and *Saccharomyces neoformans* by Francesco Sanfelice to the genus *Cryptococcus* due to its absence of ascospores. Lichen systematics 268 Lichen systematics is the study of how lichens are classified and related to each other, combining the naming of lichen taxa, the reconstruction of their evolutionary history, and the organization of this diversity into a coherent framework. In contrast to an individual fungus or plant, a lichen is not a single organism but a miniature ecosystem—a symbiotic partnership between a fungus (the mycobiont) and a photosynthetic partner (the photobiont, typically an alga or cyanobacterium). ; Grube, Martin; Tehler, Anders (1995). Toadstool generally refers to a poisonous mushroom. has been used for polypores, puffballs, jelly fungi, coral fungi, bracket fungi, stinkhorns, and cup fungi

This subphylum, along with the Mortierellomycotina, and Mucoromycotina, form the phylum Mucoromycota, a sister clade of the more well-known and diverse dikaryan fungi. f24144e6b5 Candy caps are valued for their highly aromatic qualities and are used as a flavoring. f24144e6b5 The standard for the name "mushroom" is the cultivated white button mushroom, *Agaricus bisporus*; hence, the word "mushroom" is most often applied to those fungi (Basidiomycota, Agaricomycetes) that have a stem (stipe), a cap (pileus), and gills (lamellae, sing. lamella) on the underside of the cap. "Mushroom" also describes a variety of other gilled fungi, with or without stems; therefore the term is used to describe the fleshy fruiting bodies of some Ascomycota. The gills produce microscopic spores which help the fungus spread across the ground or its occupant surface. f24144e6b5

Wildlife of Antarctica Benthic animal communities also exist around the continent. Over 1,000 fungi species have been found on and around The wildlife of Antarctica are extremophiles, having adapted to the dryness, low temperatures, and high exposure common in Antarctica. The extreme weather of the interior contrasts to the relatively mild conditions on the Antarctic Peninsula and the subantarctic islands, which have warmer temperatures and more liquid water. The oceans themselves are a more stable environment for life, both in the water column and on the seabed. Much of the ocean around the mainland is covered by sea ice. and widespread swarms during the summer f24144e6b5

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
