Fertilizer For most modern agricultural practices, fertilization focuses on three main macro nutrients: nitrogen (N), phosphorus (P), and potassium (K) with occasional addition of supplements like rock flour for micronutrients. Fertilizers may be distinct from liming materials or other non-nutrient soil amendments. Ethylene oxide is industrially produced by oxidation of ethylene in the presence of a silver catalyst. Because it is a strained ring, ethylene oxide easily participates in a number of addition reactions that result in ring-opening. It is a cyclic ether and the simplest epoxide: a three-membered ring consisting of one oxygen atom and two carbon atoms.
