The direct observation and manipulation of marine habitats afforded to scuba-equipped scientists have transformed the marine sciences generally, and marine biology and marine chemistry in particular. Some scientific diving is carried out by universities in support of undergraduate or postgraduate research programs, and government. Glossary of firefighting One problem that exists in trying to create a list such as this is that much of the terminology used by a particular department is specifically defined in their particular standing operating procedures, such that two departments may have completely different terms for the same thing. More narrowly defined by OSHA. Often Firefighting jargon includes a diverse lexicon of both common and idiosyncratic terms. Furthermore, a department may change a definition within its SOP, such that one year it may be RIT, and the next RIG or RIC. For example, depending on whom one asks, a safety team may be referred to as a standby, a RIT or RIG or RIC (rapid intervention team/group/crew), or a FAST (firefighter assist and search team). They are regulated at the most basic level by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, which sets the minimum standards that all states' EMS providers must meet, and regulated more strictly by individual state governments, which often require higher standards from the services they oversee.
