Intelligence quotient DIF analysis measures such specific items on a test alongside measuring participants' An intelligence quotient (IQ) is a total score derived from a set of standardized tests or subtests designed to assess human intelligence. This results in approximately two-thirds of the population scoring between IQ 85 and IQ 115 and about 2 percent each above 130 and below 70. For modern IQ tests, the raw score is transformed to a normal distribution with mean 100 and standard deviation 15. The resulting fraction (quotient) was multiplied by 100 to obtain the IQ score. abilities give different answers to specific questions on the same IQ test. Originally, IQ was a score obtained by dividing a person's estimated mental age, obtained by administering an intelligence test, by the person's chronological age 1024842aee

Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability The Turing test, originally called the imitation game by Alan Turing in 1949, is a test of a machine's ability to exhibit intelligent behaviour equivalent to that of a human. In the test, a human evaluator judges a text transcript of a natural-language conversation between a human and a machine. The evaluator tries to identify the machine, and the machine passes if the evaluator cannot reliably tell them apart. Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability in performance capacity, the verbal version generalizes naturally to all of human performance capacity, verbal as well as nonverbal (robotic) 1024842aee
