Introduction to M-theory Although a complete mathematical formulation of M-theory is not known, the general approach is the leading contender for a universal "Theory of Everything" that unifies gravity with other forces such as electromagnetism. non-technical terms, M-theory presents an idea about the basic substance of the universe. In comparison, other theories such as loop quantum gravity are considered by physicists and researchers to be less elegant, because they posit gravity to be completely different from forces such as the electromagnetic force. String theory String theory describes how these strings propagate through space and interact with each other. On distance scales larger than the string scale, a string acts like a particle, with its mass, charge, and other properties determined by the vibrational state of the string. In string theory, D-branes are an important class of branes that arise In physics, string theory is a theoretical framework in which the point-like particles of particle physics are replaced by one-dimensional objects called strings. analogous to the electromagnetic field which live on the worldvolume of a brane. Thus, string theory is a theory of quantum gravity. In

Electromagnetic articulography EMA uses sensor coils placed on the tongue and other parts of the mouth to measure their position and movement over time during speech and swallowing. EMA uses sensor coils placed on the tongue and other parts of the mouth. Because the current induced is inversely proportional to the cube of the distance, a computer is able to analyse the current produced and determine the sensor coil's location in space. Induction coils around the head produce an electromagnetic field that creates, or induces, a current in the sensors in the mouth.
