These embodied factors include the motor system, the perceptual system, bodily interactions with the environment (situatedness), and the assumptions about the world that shape the functional structure of the brain and body of the organism. The Gesture Embodied cognition represents a diverse group of theories which investigate how cognition is shaped by the bodily state and capacities of the organism. movements based on either verbal or on motor processes. Embodied cognition suggests that these elements are essential to a wide spectrum of cognitive functions, such as perception biases, memory recall, comprehension and high-level mental constructs (such as meaning attribution and categories) and performance on various cognitive tasks (reasoning or judgment)

Christian and Islamic philosophers such as Boethius (died 524), Avicenna (died 1037), Thomas Aquinas (died 1274) and William of Ockham (died 1347) further developed Aristotle's logic in the Middle Ages, reaching a high point in the mid-fourteenth century, with Jean Buridan. The period between the fourteenth century and the beginning of the nineteenth century saw largely decline... Arithmetic systems can be distinguished based on the type of numbers they

operate on. Integer arithmetic is about calculations with positive and negative integers. Rational number arithmetic involves operations on fractions of integers. Real number arithmetic is about calculations with real numbers, which include both rational and irrational numbers.

Theory of multiple intelligences Introduced in Howard Gardner's book *Frames of Mind: The Theory of Multiple Intelligences* (1983), this framework has gained popularity among educators who accordingly develop varied teaching strategies purported to cater to different student strengths. Dyscalculia is associated with dysfunction in the region around the intraparietal sulcus and potentially also the frontal lobe. The school begins with Boole's seminal work *Mathematical Analysis of Logic* The history of logic deals with the study of the development of the science of valid inference (logic). Formal logics developed in ancient times in India, China, and Greece. The Stoics, especially Chrysippus, began the development of predicate logic. formalise reasoning in the area of classes, propositions, and probabilities

Nyaya Nyāya's most significant contributions to Indian philosophy were the systematic development of the theory of logic, methodology, and its treatises on epistemology. development, has been one of systematising patterns of mathematical reasoning, with the mathematical objects being thought of as existing either in an independent Nyāya (Sanskrit: न्याय, IAST: *nyāyaḥ*), literally meaning "justice", "rules", "method" or "judgment", is one of the six orthodox (Āstika) schools of Hindu philosophy

Modern cognitive tests originated through the work of James McKeen Cattell who coined the term "mental tests". They followed Francis Galton's development of physical and physiological tests. For example, Galton measured strength of grip and height and weight. He established an "Anthropometric Laboratory" in the 1880s where patrons paid to have physical and physiological attributes measured... According to Kreger Silverman, of the 30% of the general population who use visual/spatial thinking, only a. It is common in approximately 60–65% of the general population. including visual, kinesthetic, musical, mathematical, and verbal thinking styles, are a common part of many current teacher training courses. "Real picture thinkers", those who use visual thinking almost to the exclusion of other kinds of thinking, make up a smaller percentage of the population. Research by child development theorist Linda Kreger Silverman suggests that less than 30% of the population strongly uses visual/spatial thinking, another 45% uses both visual/spatial thinking and thinking in the form of words, and 25% thinks exclusively in words.
