Man o' War Several sports publications, including The Blood-Horse, Sports Illustrated, and the Associated Press, voted Man o' War as the best American racehorse of the 20th century. He was inducted into the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in 1957. On March 29, 2017, the museum opened a special exhibit in his honor, "Man o' War at 100". During his racing career, just after World War I, Man o' War won 20 of 21 races and \$249,465 (equivalent to \$4,009,000 in 2025) in purses. He was the unofficial 1920 American horse of the year and was honored with Babe Ruth as the outstanding athlete of the year by The

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New York Times. In May 1922, he was moved to Faraway Farm, a property on Huffman Mill Pike outside of Lexington that had been Man o' War (March 29, 1917 - November 1, 1947) was an American Thoroughbred racehorse who is widely regarded as one of the greatest racehorses of all time. originally at Elizabeth Daingerfield's Hinata Farm

Teenoso was a dark-coated bay horse with a small white star and a white sock on his left hind leg, bred in Kentucky by Ralph "Budgie" Moller and his brother, Eric, who owned the colt during his racing career. He was described as a bay when racing, but when standing at stud he was described as being "dark bay or brown". Teenoso was the best horse sired by Youth, the winner of the Prix du Jockey Club Washington, D.C. International in 1976. His dam, Furioso, who finished second in the 1974 Epsom Oaks, also produced the racemare Topsy, who finished second in the 1000 Guineas and won both the Sun... Jayne and his younger brothers, DeForest and Frank,...

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Cadland Cadland was disappointing as a sire of winners in England and was exported to France, where he was much more successful. Cadland claimed the trophy by beating Zinganee in their sixth and final encounter, but the race was extremely grueling for both horses: Zinganee never ran Cadland (1825-1837) was a British Thoroughbred racehorse and sire. He died in 1837. He went on to have a long and successful racing career, winning a further eleven races before his retirement, and developing a notable rivalry with his contemporary Zinganee. In a career that lasted from April 1828 to 1831 he ran twenty-five times and won fifteen races, with several of his wins being walkovers in which all of his opponents were withdrawn. In the summer of 1828 he ran a dead heat with The Colonel in the Derby, before winning the race in a deciding run-off 11758fc4ef

== Spier's Parklands == 11758fc4ef Jayne was born on July 3, 1907, in Cuba Township, in Lake County, Illinois. He was one of four boys and eight girls born to Arthur and Katherine Jayne. Silas had a half-brother, George William Jayne, born in 1923 to his mother and her

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employer, married attorney George William Spinner. When Silas was tried for rape at age 17, his stepfather, acting as his attorney, wrote to the judge saying that Silas was a wild young man who would not be hurt by a year in jail. Over hurdles, he was the best Tom Dreaper ever trained, a long way superior to Arkle in that discipline, as evidenced by the fact that stable jockey Pat Taaffe could not ride Arkle in 3 of his 5 handicap hurdles because he was unable to do the very light weights that Arkle was set to carry in those races, and in two of which he finished unplaced when carrying just 10-1 and 10-5. However, whereas Arkle is feted and remembered as the greatest steeplechaser of all time, Flyingbolt has been all but forgotten 11758fc4ef

After winning one minor race as a two-year-old, he showed improved form in 1980 to win the Classic Trial Stakes and the Chester Vase. His sire was Hawaii, a South Henbit (28 March 1977 - 1997) was an American-bred and British-trained Thoroughbred racehorse, best known for winning the Derby in 1980

Teenoso He proved to be a disappointment at stud. After showing moderate form as a two-year-old, he improved in the spring of 1983 to win the Group Three Lingfield Derby Trial and the Epsom Derby, giving Lester Piggott a record ninth win in the Classic race. 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Stud at Sherborne Teenoso (7 April 1980 - 4 October 1999) was an American-bred, British-trained Thoroughbred racehorse. Teenoso was beaten in his two remaining races that year but showed good form as a four-year-old, winning the Ormonde Stakes, the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and, on his final appearance, the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes

Eglinton Country Park It was also known as &#039;Adam&#039;s Block&#039;. coach house and stables for coach horses as well. Horse breeders are usually not required to do this, but often find it to be a good form of commercial promotion to include a stable name or farm initials In animal husbandry, a breed registry, also known as a herdbook, studbook or register, is an official list of animals within a specific breed whose parents are known. The terms studbook and register are also used to refer to lists of male animals "standing at stud", that is, those animals actively breeding, as opposed to every known specimen of that breed. Such registries usually issue certificates for each recorded animal, called a pedigree, pedigreed animal documentation, or most commonly, an animal's "papers" 11758fc4ef

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his Idle Hour Stables to a Silas Carter Jayne (July 3, 1907 - July 13, 1987) was a Chicago-based stable owner, horse trainer, and horse trader who was heavily involved in criminal activity, including fraud, intimidation, arson, and murder. In 1980, Silas was also tried and acquitted of arson, after he allegedly persuaded a former cellmate of his to start a fire in a stable, where men against whom Silas had a grudge kept their horses. Riding Stables, and after that he bought Green Tree Stables from Silas, renaming it Happy Days Stables. Silas died of leukemia in 1987, aged 80 11758fc4ef

Bred in California, the chestnut-colored horse was named for his flashy white markings, called "chrome" by horse aficionados. He was bred and originally owned by Perry Martin from Yuba City, California, and Steve Coburn of Topaz Lake, Nevada, who named their partnership DAP Racing, standing for "Dumb Ass Partners"—a tongue-in-cheek response to a passerby who questioned their wisdom in purchasing California Chrome's dam, Love the Chase. In 2015, Coburn sold his minority share to Taylor Made Farm, and a new ownership group, California Chrome, LLC, was formed. The horse is trained by the father-son team of Art and Alan Sherman. Dedicated fans—called "Chromies"—actively supported California Chrome, who has been called "the people's horse".
