Waste management law Waste management laws also regulate organic waste disposal, including composting which is increasingly being recognized as a more sustainable alternative to landfilling and incineration. Regulatory efforts include classifying waste types, setting standards for transport, treatment, storage. Waste laws are generally designed to minimize or eliminate the uncontrolled dispersal of waste materials into the environment. Most waste management laws are designed to reduce the generation of waste and promote or mandate waste recycling. When left unregulated, these dispersals can cause ecological or biological harm.
