Sampling bias In statistics, sampling bias is a bias in which a sample is collected in such a way that some members of the intended population have a lower or higher In statistics, sampling bias is a bias in which a sample is collected in such a way that some members of the intended population have a lower or higher sampling probability than others. If this is not accounted for, results can be erroneously attributed to the phenomenon under study rather than to the method of sampling. It results in a biased sample of a population (or non-human factors) in which all individuals, or instances, were not equally likely to have been selected 8b5ef84114

Sampling (statistics) In this statistics, quality assurance, and survey methodology, sampling is the selection of a subset or a statistical sample (termed sample for short) In this statistics, quality assurance, and survey methodology, sampling is the selection of a subset or a statistical sample (termed sample for short) of individuals from within a statistical population to estimate characteristics of the whole population. The subset is meant to reflect the whole population, and statisticians attempt to collect samples that are representative of the population. Sampling has lower costs and faster data collection compared to recording data from the entire population (in many cases, collecting the whole population is impossible, like getting sizes of all stars in the universe), and thus, it can provide insights in cases where it is infeasible to measure an entire population 8b5ef84114

When census data (comprising every member of the target population) cannot be collected, statisticians collect data by developing specific experiment designs and survey samples... 8b5ef84114
 Bootstrapping estimates the properties of an estimand (such as its variance) by measuring those properties when sampling from an approximating distribution.
