Seat belt Evidence A seat belt or seatbelt, also known as a safety belt, is a vehicle safety device designed to secure the driver or a passenger of a vehicle against harmful movement that may result during a collision or a sudden stop. the 1980s, three-point belts were commonly available only in the front outboard seats of cars; the back seats were often only fitted with lap belts. A seat belt reduces the likelihood of death or serious injury in a traffic collision by reducing the force of secondary impacts with interior strike hazards, by keeping occupants positioned correctly for maximum effectiveness of the airbag (if equipped), and by preventing occupants being ejected from the vehicle in a crash or if the vehicle rolls over 60c255ff5b

Toyota Tercel Manufactured at the Takaoka plant in Toyota City, Japan, and sharing its platform with the Cynos (aka Paseo) and the Starlet, the Tercel was marketed variously as the Toyota Corolla II (Japanese: トヨタII, Toyota Karōra II)—sold at Toyota Japanese dealerships called Toyota Corolla Stores—and was replaced by the Platz in 1999. RMS Lusitania The outboard turbines operated at high pressure; the exhaust steam then RMS Lusitania was a British ocean liner launched by the Cunard Line in 1906 as a Royal Mail Ship. She was the world's largest passenger ship until the completion of her sister Mauretania three months later. the two inboard propellers rotated inward, while those outboard rotated outward. In 1907, she gained the Blue Riband appellation for the fastest Atlantic crossing, which had been held by German ships for a decade 60c255ff5b

Flap (aeronautics) Flaps are used to reduce the take-off distance and the landing distance. Reducing the proportion of the lift supplied by the outboard half of the wing A flap is a high-lift device used to reduce the stalling speed of an aircraft wing at a given weight. Subskimmer Its outboard motor has a long snorkel so the Subskimmer can run on motor just submerged to try to avoid detection. Thus it transforms between a fast light surface boat and a submerged diver propulsion vehicle. propulsion vehicle which is a form of rigid inflatable boat (RIB) with an outboard petrol (gasoline) engine. The batteries, being heavy, are in a thick tube along its keel. When submerged it seals its engine and runs with battery-electric thrusters, which are on a rotatable cross-arm, and is deflated.
