After the July 1990 referendum, Milošević's Socialist Party of Serbia (SPS), Vuk Drašković's Serbian Renewal Movement (SPO), and General elections were held in Serbia, a constituent federal unit of SFR Yugoslavia, in December 1990 to elect the president of Serbia and members of the National Assembly. The elections were scheduled after the ratification of a new constitution on 28 September, which was approved by voters in a referendum held in July 9c2867fcc1
