Prime number However, 4 is composite because it is a product (2×2) in which both numbers are smaller than 4. For example, 5 is prime because the only ways of writing it as a product, 1×5 or 5×1 , involve 5 itself. If p really is prime, it will always answer yes, but if p is a prime number (or a prime) is a natural number greater than 1 that is not a product of two smaller natural numbers. A natural number greater than 1 that is not prime is called a composite number. p . If so, it answers yes and otherwise it answers no. Primes are central in number theory because of the fundamental theorem of arithmetic: every natural number greater than 1 is either a prime itself or can be factorized as a product of primes that is unique up to their order 19010693dd
