Convenience sampling is not often recommended by official statistical agencies for research due to the possibility of sampling error and lack of representation of the population. It can be useful in some situations, for example, where convenience sampling is the only possible option. A trade off exists between this method of quick sampling and accuracy. Collected samples may not represent the population of interest and can be a source of bias, with larger sample sizes reducing the chance of sampling error occurring. 80545f827e

Qualitative research is a type of research that aims to gather and analyse non-numerical (descriptive) data in order to gain an understanding of individuals' social reality, including understanding their attitudes, beliefs, and motivation. This type of research typically involves in-depth interviews, focus groups, or field observations in order to collect data that is rich in detail and context. Qualitative research is often used to explore complex phenomena or to gain insight into people's experiences and perspectives on a particular topic.
