One-time pad In this technique, a plaintext is paired with a random secret key (also referred to as a one-time pad). The material on the selected sheet is the key for this message The one-time pad (OTP) is an encryption technique that cannot be cracked in cryptography. It requires the use of a single-use pre-shared key that is larger than or equal to the size of the message being sent. Then, each bit or character of the plaintext is encrypted by combining it with the corresponding bit or character from the pad using modular addition. instance "use the 12th sheet on 1 May", or "use the next available sheet for the next message"

Overtone While the fundamental is usually heard most prominently, overtones are actually present in any pitch except a true sine wave. In other words, overtones are all pitches higher than the lowest pitch within an individual sound; the fundamental is the lowest pitch. (An overtone may or may not be a harmonic). The relative volume or amplitude of various overtone partials is one of the key identifying features of timbre, or the individual characteristic of a sound.
