Those parts of the four canonical Gospels that describe these events are known as the Passion narratives. Historicity of Jesus Mainstream New Testament scholarship ignores the non-existence hypothesis and its arguments, as the question of historicity was generally settled in scholarship in the early 20th century, and the general consensus among modern scholars is that a Jewish man named Jesus of Nazareth existed in the Herodian Kingdom of Judea and the subsequent Herodian tetrarchy in the 1st century AD, upon whose life and teachings Christianity was later constructed. Christians believe that Jesus is the messiah foretold in the Hebrew Bible and the Christian Old Testament. Names and titles of Jesus in the New Testament In Christianity, the two names Jesus and Emmanuel that refer to Jesus in the New Testament have salvific attributes. One element of the process of understanding and proclaiming Jesus was the attribution of titles to him. After the crucifixion of Jesus the early Church did not simply repeat his messages, but focused on him, proclaimed him, and tried to understand and explain his message. Some of the titles that were gradually used in the early Church and then appeared in the New Testament were adopted from

the Jewish context of the age, while others were selected to refer to, and underscore the message, mission and teachings of Jesus. In time, some of these titles gathered Christological significance. In Islamic eschatology, Jesus (ʿĪsā ibn Maryam) is also believed to return in the end times. According to Islamic belief, he will descend from Heaven to defeat the false messiah (al-Masih ad-Dajjal), restore justice, and reaffirm monotheism. His return is regarded as one of the major signs of the Day of Judgment, and he is viewed as a revered prophet, not divine, in Islamic theology. 9ed686a0fb

Nativity of Jesus The majority of contemporary scholars do not see the two canonical gospel Nativity stories as historically factual since they present clashing accounts and irreconcilable genealogies. Some view the question of historicity as secondary, given that gospels were primarily written as theological. The two accounts agree that Jesus was born in Bethlehem, modern day Palestine, in Roman-controlled Judea, that his mother, Mary, was engaged to a man named Joseph, who was descended from King David and was not his biological father, and that his birth was caused by divine intervention.
