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Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages
The full name of the course was originally the Certificate in English Language Teaching to Adults and is still referred to in

this way by some course providers. CELTA was developed to be suitable both for those interested in Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL) and for Teaching English to the Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL). However, in 2011 the qualification title was amended on the Ofqual register to the Cambridge English Level 5 Certificate In Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (CELTA). It is provided by Cambridge Assessment English through authorised Cambridge English Teaching Qualification centres and can be taken either full-time or part-time. CELTA is designed for candidates with little or no previous English. CELTA is an initial teacher training qualification for teaching English as a second or foreign language (ESL and EFL). It reflects the wider range of students that teachers might have, including younger learners.

educational resources that help English language learners and teachers to achieve their goals using innovative content, methods or media The ELTons (English Language Teaching Innovation Awards) are international awards given annually by the British Council that recognise and celebrate innovation in the field of English language teaching. Applications are submitted by the end of November each year and they are judged by an independent panel of ELT experts, using the Delphi Technique. The ELTons date from 2003 and the 2018 sponsors of the awards are Cambridge English Language Assessment and IELTS.
