"3: Classical Theories of Organizational Communication",. Organizational Communication Within the realm of communication studies, organizational communication is a field of study surrounding all areas of communication and information flow that contribute to the functioning of an organization

Chester Barnard recognized that individuals behave differently when acting in their organizational role than when acting separately from the organization. Organizational behavior researchers study the behavior of individuals primarily in their organizational roles. One of the main goals of organizational behavior research is "to revitalize organizational theory and develop a better conceptualization... The status of behavioral economics as a subfield of economics is a fairly recent development; the breakthroughs... Behavioral economics began as a distinct field of study in the 1970s and 1980s, but can be traced back to 18th-century economists, such as Adam Smith, who deliberated how the economic behavior of individuals could be influenced by their desires. He is best known for developing one of the earliest and most popular frameworks for measuring cultural dimensions in a global perspective. Here he described national cultures along six dimensions: power distance, individualism, uncertainty avoidance, masculinity, long term

orientation, and indulgence vs. restraint. He was known for his books *Culture's Consequences* and *Cultures and Organizations: Software of the Mind*, co-authored with his son Gert Jan Hofstede. The latter...

As organizational cultures are learned, shared, and transmitted a collective social reality Symbolic behavior is "a person's capacity to respond to or use a system of significant symbols" (Faules & Alexander, 1978, p. The symbolic behavior perspective argues that the reality of an organization is socially constructed through communication (Cheney & Christensen, 2000; Putnam, Phillips, & Chapman, 1996). 5). Symbolic messages are used by individuals to understand their environment and create a social reality (Faules & Alexander, 1978; Mills, 2002).
