The CMT was first administered in 1985, in response to the Regan administrations education report A Nation at Risk. Students read four passages and answer

questions about them. The CMT covers mathematics, reading comprehension, writing, and science (science was first included in March 2008). The other major standardized test in Connecticut is the Connecticut Academic Performance Test, or CAPT, which is given in grade 10 ab53a96274
