He commissioned the project, which envisaged the construction of sixty houses with garden and all the services necessary, to Antoni Gaudí. Influenced by neo-Gothic art and Oriental techniques, Gaudí became part of the Modernista movement, which peaked in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. His work eventually transcended mainstream Modernisme, developing into a unique style inspired by natural forms.
