Subduction The volcanism Subduction is a geological process in which the oceanic lithosphere and some continental lithosphere is recycled into the Earth's mantle at the convergent boundaries between tectonic plates. The process of subduction has created most of the Earth's continental crust. A region where this process occurs is known as a subduction zone, and its surface expression is known as an arc-trench complex. Where one tectonic plate converges with a second plate, the heavier plate dives beneath the other and sinks into the mantle. Rates of subduction are typically measured in centimeters per year, with rates of convergence as high as 11 cm/year. generally form 10–50 km below the volcanoes within the volcanic arcs and are only visible on the surface once the volcanoes have weathered away 1e78253ac6
