History of herbalism These systems often have a significant herbal component. Evidence-based use of pharmaceutical drugs, often derived from medicinal plants, has largely replaced herbal treatments in modern health care. The history of herbalism is closely tied with the history of medicine from prehistoric times up until the development of the germ theory of disease in the 19th century. However, many people continue to employ various forms of traditional or alternative medicine. The history of herbalism also overlaps with food history, as many of the herbs and spices historically used by humans to season food yield useful medicinal compounds, and use of spices with antimicrobial activity in cooking is. Modern medicine from the 19th century to today has been based on evidence gathered using the scientific method d50fe73a7a

Chamaemelum nobile C. became a mainstay of herb gardens across the British Isles. *nobile* was listed first in the pharmacopoeia of Württemberg as a carminative, painkiller, *Chamaemelum nobile*, commonly known as chamomile (also spelled camomile), is a low perennial plant found in dry fields and around gardens and cultivated grounds in Europe, North America, and South America. Its synonym is *Anthemis nobilis*, with various common names, such as Roman chamomile, English chamomile, garden chamomile, ground apple, low chamomile, mother's daisy or whig plant d50fe73a7a

The earliest historical records of herbs are found from the Sumerian civilization, where hundreds of medicinal plants including opium are listed on clay tablets, c. 3000 BC. The Ebers Papyrus from ancient Egypt, c. 1550 BC, describes over 850 plant medicines. The Greek physician Dioscorides, who worked in the Roman army, documented over 1000 recipes for medicines using over 600 medicinal plants in *De materia medica*, c. 60 AD; this formed the basis of pharmacopoeias for some 1500... d50fe73a7a The work describes many drugs known to be effective, including aconite, aloes, colocynth, colchicum, henbane, opium and squill. In total, about 600 plants are covered, along with some animals and mineral substances, and around 1000 medicines made from them. d50fe73a7a

Eucalyptus oil *polybractea* have the highest cineole content, ranging from 80 to 95%. The leaves of selected Eucalyptus species are steam distilled to extract eucalyptus oil. Eucalyptus oil has a history of wide application, as a pharmaceutical, antiseptic, repellent, flavouring and fragrance, as well as having industrial uses. The British Pharmacopoeia states that the oil must have a minimum cineole content of 70% if Eucalyptus oil is the generic name for distilled oil from the leaves of Eucalyptus, a genus of the plant family Myrtaceae, mostly native to Australia but cultivated worldwide d50fe73a7a

Common abortifacients used in performing medical abortions include mifepristone, which is typically used in conjunction with misoprostol in a two-step approach.
