legal standards based on morality that underlie and inform the creation, interpretation, and application of human-made laws. comparative analysis: Some authors of natural law examine historical legal systems and comparative law to identify common moral principles embedded within them Natural law (Latin: *ius naturale*, *lex naturalis*) is a philosophical and legal theory that posits the existence of a set of inherent laws derived from nature and universal moral principles, which are discoverable through reason. In ethics, natural law theory asserts that certain rights and moral values are inherent in human nature and can be understood universally, independent of enacted laws or societal norms. This contrasts with positive law (as in legal positivism), which emphasizes that laws are rules created by human authorities and are not necessarily

Two-party system At any point in time, one of the two parties typically holds a majority in the legislature and is usually referred to as the majority or governing party while the other is the minority or opposition party. Around the world, the term is used to refer to one of two kinds of party systems. Both result from Duverger's law, which demonstrates that "winner-take-all" or "first-past-the-post" elections produce two dominant parties over time. Two-party system

Obligations in both tort and criminal. tort law in civil law jurisdictions largely derives from Roman law, common law jurisdictions derive their tort law from customary English tort law. In A tort is a civil wrong, other than breach of contract, that causes a claimant to suffer loss or harm, resulting in legal liability for the person who commits the tortious act. Some wrongful acts, such as assault and battery, can

result in both a civil lawsuit and a criminal prosecution in countries where the civil and criminal legal systems are separate. Tort law can be contrasted with criminal law, which deals with criminal wrongs that are punishable by the state

The Payment of Wages Act 1936 mandates the payment of wages on time on the last working day of every month via bank transfer or postal service. Overtime is strongly discouraged with the premium on overtime being 100% of the total wage. Traditionally, the Indian government at the federal and state levels has sought to ensure a high degree of protection for workers, but in practice, this differs due to the form of government and because labour is a subject in the concurrent list of the Indian Constitution. The Minimum Wages Act 1948 requires companies to pay the minimum wage set by the government alongside limiting working weeks to 40 hours (9 hours a day including an hour of break)

Unlike common law systems, which rely heavily on judicial precedent, civil law systems are characterized by their reliance on legal codes that function as the primary source of law. *Bürgerliches Gesetzbuch* (1900). Today, civil law is the world's most common legal system, practiced in about 150 countries

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Civil law notary that distinguishes a civil-law notary's instruments from those of a common lawyer is the fact that, under common law legal systems, drafts and non-identical Civil-law notaries, or Latin notaries, are lawyers of noncontentious private civil law who draft, take, and record legal instruments for private parties, provide legal advice and give attendance in person, and are vested as public officers with the authentication power of the State. They often receive generally the same education as attorneys at civil law with further specialised education but without qualifications in advocacy, procedural law or the law of evidence,. As opposed to most notaries public, their common-law counterparts, civil-law notaries are highly trained, licensed practitioners providing a full range of regulated legal services, and whereas they hold a public office, they nonetheless operate usually—but not always—in private practice and are paid on a fee-for-service basis

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Presidential system The defining A presidential, strong-president, or single-executive system (sometimes also congressional system) is a form of government in which a head of government (usually titled "president") heads an executive branch that derives its authority and legitimacy from a source that is separate from the legislative

branch. The system was popularized by its inclusion in the Constitution of the United States. presidential system. Several characteristics are unique to presidential systems or prominent in countries that use presidential systems

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
